



White Rock Stables Jump Safety Guidelines, Reminders, and Etiquette

- Jumping is a dangerous sport; if you choose to jump your horse at WRS, you are jumping at your own risk.
- All persons using the jumps, whether they are owned by WRS, Eryn Zeller, or the jumper, are required to sign a release of liability form prior to use (those under the age of 18 will require a parent or guardian to sign the form)
- Non-stables members are prohibited from jumping on WRS property unless they have signed the waiver **AND** have received prior approval from Amelita Facchiano or Eryn Zeller. All non-stables members under the age of 18 are required to sign the release of liability form regardless of whether they use the jumps.
- Never jump alone
- If you are under the age of 18, adult supervision is required when using the jumps. As a reminder, those under the age of 21 must always be accompanied by an adult when on the property, regardless if they are riding.
- If you are under the age of 18, you are required to wear a certified riding helmet when using the jumps and WRS strongly encourages all persons using the jump facilities to wear a helmet, regardless of age.
- We will continue to uphold the rule stating that the hunt field and jumps are off limits to jumpers or riders until a minimum of 72 hours have passed. During the first 72 hours, cantering, galloping, and jumping are strictly **prohibited**. Please note that 72 hours is the minimum length of time but is subject to lengthen should we experience large amounts of rain. This especially applies in the cooler months when low temperatures and minimal sun prevent the ground from drying within 72 hours. - If you move, relocate or alter the jumps, please exercise proper hunt etiquette and return jumps to their original location and setup keeping in mind that spacing is important.
- If you set up jumps on the outside path of the lower exercise ring, please be sure to move them from the main path after use. This is a multipurpose ring which is used by non-jumping riders; it is not proper etiquette to leave jumps on the main path when not every horse/rider is capable of using them.
- Lastly, please remember that the jumps are not toys. Eryn has invested considerable amounts of time and personal finances to paint, create, and refurbish the jumps. Please be respectful.

Please adhere to the aforementioned guidelines as these are designed for the safety of the rider, horses, other boarders, and visitors at WRS. Failure to comply with these rules may result in suspension or termination of the jump facilities.
